- **POSTMARKS:** Handy little collection with lots of QEII philatelic covers from small Post Offices but also with commercial covers including 1938 'BAILEYS BAY' local, 1941 'DEVONSHIRE NORTH' to GB, 1950 'DEVONSHIRE SOUTH' local, 1938 'HARRINGTON SOUND' local, 1938 superb 'MANGROVE BAY' local & Hamilton slogans, plus a range of earlier mostly part-strikes on stamp or piece; also a batch of 41 First Day Covers including 1936 Pictorials set with 'FLATTS' cds & FDI handstamp, 1940 2d SG 112a strip of 6 & 'HALF/PENNY' on 1d *Imprint* strip of 6 (both plain covers), etc; plus philatelic flights & paquebot covers including 1928 with 'MS *Bermuda*' h/s, 1928 with oval 'RMSP AVON/PURSEERS OFFICE' d/s, 1938 with 'MS *Bermuda*' h/s (apparently commercial); condition a bit mixed. **(97 covers)**
