393 C B **BOER WAR:** 1902 OAS cover endorsed "CW St John Clarke Lt/4th Battn ACH" to Victoria with 'NEWCASTLE/NATAL' cds & '1D' tax h/s, unusually routed via Sydney (b/s) where 'MORE TO PAY/1D' h/s added, at Melbourne (b/s) 'T1D'-in-oval h/s added, Victoria Postage Due 1d tied by 'HAWTHORN' arrival cds. Very scarce: the *Australian Commonwealth Horse* arrived in South Africa only in April 1902 & hostilities ceased on 31/5/1902.

600^T**QUEENSLAND - Postal History****Lot 427**

427 C B **1900** local cover with Boer War Charity 1d SG 264a tied by 'WARWICK/JY1801+QUEENSLAND+' cds, the reverse stained.

300^T**VICTORIA****Lot 481**

481 V A A1 **1900 Boer War Charity** 1d & 2d SG 374-5, exceptional centring, tied to a single piece by contemporary Melbourne postal cds, Cat £310. Postal usage (albeit philatelic) is much scarcer than mint or CTO examples.
