RO 6/2/1911; PO 1/7/1927; closed 28/9/1984. [This office may have avoided being renamed during World War I because "shank" didn't sound German! After all, that's how <i>Rodney Overton</i> spelled it]	100
452	S	A A2+	<b>Quondong:</b> '[QU]ONDONG/DE7/85/S-A' superb strike on 2d orange. Rated RRRR. PO 1/9/1884; renamed Pine Valley 12/11/1900.	200
