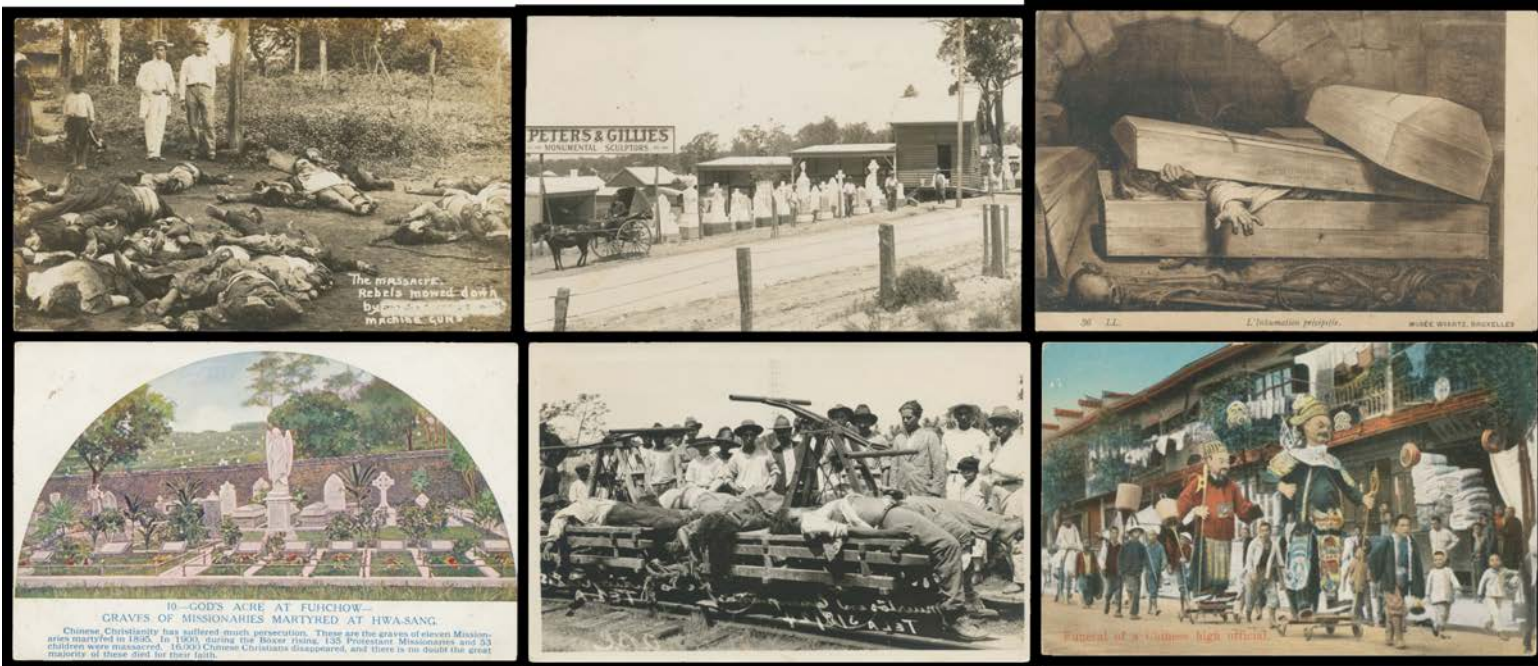

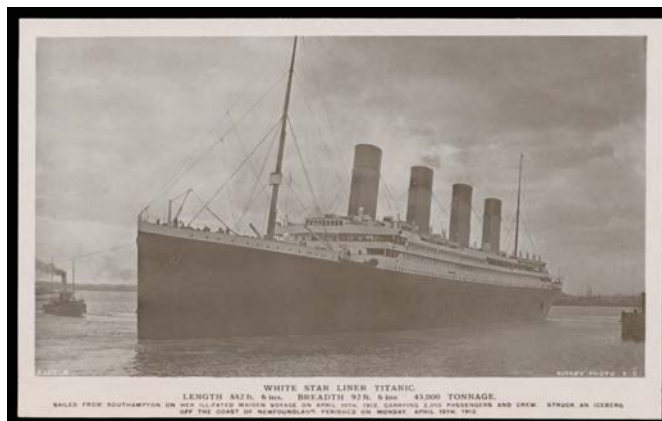

218 C SHIPPING: Mostly British collection of predominantly Passenger Vessels from famous Ocean Liners to cross-Channel vessels plus about 20 Paddle Steamers and some Commercial Vessels, all the major British Lines represented plus a number of smaller &/or less well-known companies, numerous artist cards including a few "poster" types & real photo types including Dry Docks and the ill-fated "Suevic" (1907, of the wreck), "Empress of Ireland" (sank in May 1914, more than 1000 lives lost), "Lusitania" (torpedoed in World War I) & "Rawalpindi" (sunk by the Germans on 3.11.1939), also about 50 non-British cards & a similar number of "moderns", mostly unused but some postmark interest including Paquebot usages, generally fine to very fine. The pilot, <i>Edgar Wikner Percival</i> , served in the Middle East with the <i>AIF</i> & was accepted into the <i>Royal Flying Corps</i> . In 1919 he established a successful aviation business at Richmond (NSW) & later became a highly respected aircraft designer] | 100 |

| 362 | C | A- | 1925 Murray (Gympie) real photo "Rocky Mail Disaster", a terrific photo showing damage to the railway line on the trestle bridge, wreckage of several carriages in the ravine, plus an array of workers, gawkers & a lone policeman, a few minor spots on the reverse, unused. <i>Ex Coe-ee Picture Library.</i> [The disaster occurred on 10.6.1925, south of Gympie, when the overnight mail train from Brisbane to Rockhampton was partly derailed. At the time, it was the worst railway disaster in Queensland, with 9 killed & 48 injured] | 100 |

SOUTH AUSTRALIA**Lot 373**

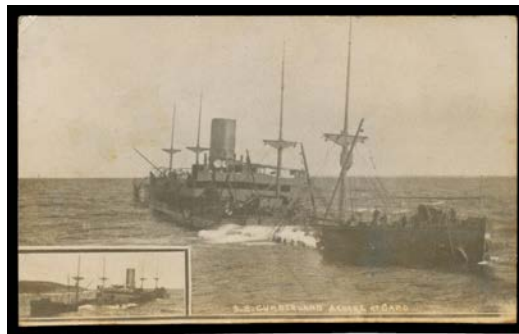
373 C A- **1909 real photo "Survivors Clan Ranald Wreck 31.1.09"**, unused. *Ex Bronte Watts*. [This was one of the worst shipwrecks in South Australian waters. Six Europeans - including the captain - & 34 crew members died. The 20 surviving seaman - all of various Asian origins - fell foul of Australia's then official "White Australia" policy; they were seized, handprinted & deported!]

**Ex Lot 385**

385 C **RAILWAYS:** the companion lot of *real photos of Railway Disasters* at Kapunda x5, Murray Bridge (a carriage is actually on the platform!), the cataclysmic derailling at Port Augusta on 28/3/1914 x9, and three others unidentified but believed to be within South Australia, condition variable but generally fine to very fine. Wow! *Ex Bronte Watts.(17)*

442 C B **1917 Dufty (Sydney) real photo "SS Cumberland ashore at Gabo"** plus small inset photo at lower-left, soiling mainly on the address side, unused. *Ex Bob Young*. [On 5/7/1917, the "Cumberland" was damaged by mines laid by the German Raider "Wolf". Run aground on Gabo Island, the huge hole in her side was repaired but she sank when under tow to Sydney. She was the only ship sunk by the Germans in Victorian waters]

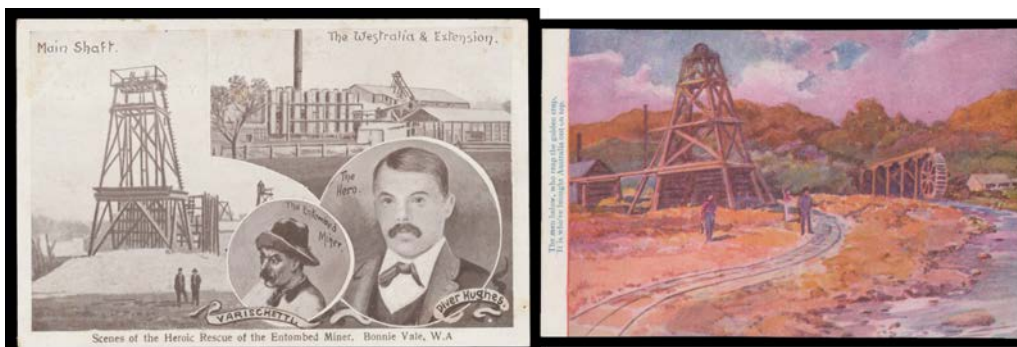

(unused) & "Diver Hughes finding the Entombed Miner...", another by <i>May Gibbs</i> "Diver Hughes Succouring Varischetti", <i>No Publisher's Name</i> "Hero of the Disaster - Diver F Hughes" and a garish artist card of the mine with advertising for the <i>Bland Holt</i> production "The Great Rescue" (unused), some minor blemishes. Ex <i>Shirley Jones</i> . [In May 1907, the mine was flooded after a thunderstorm, trapping <i>Modesto Varischetti</i> . 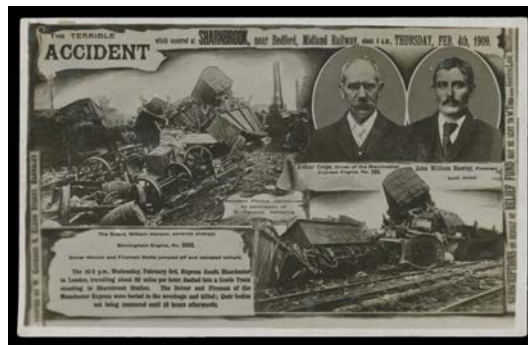
