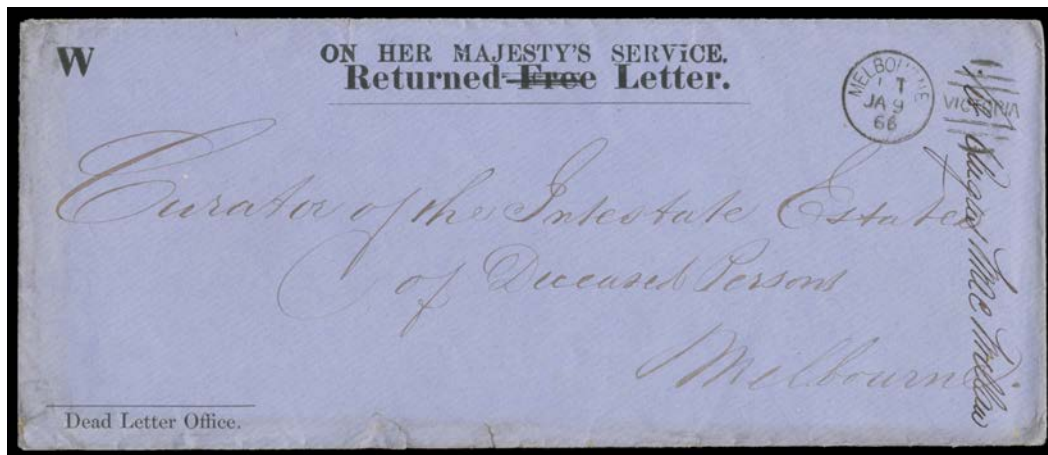

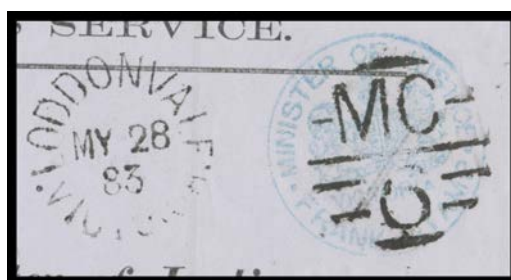

974 C A **1842** entire to Kandy with light but fine strike of the rare octagonal [crown]/COLOMBO/POST FREE/14NO14/1842' with Reversed 'S' d/s in red (*Proud #OPD8; the later of only two recorded examples*) partly across a very fine colourless embossing of the rare 'CEYLON/[crown]/DIEU ET MON DROIT/GOVERNMENT' device (**the earliest of only 5 examples recorded**). **One of the most important items of the pre-stamp period, and of remarkable quality, being thought to be the finest of the five recorded examples.** *Ex Ted Proud.* [This Colombo Free marking doesn't conform to any of *Oxley's* listings] 1,750

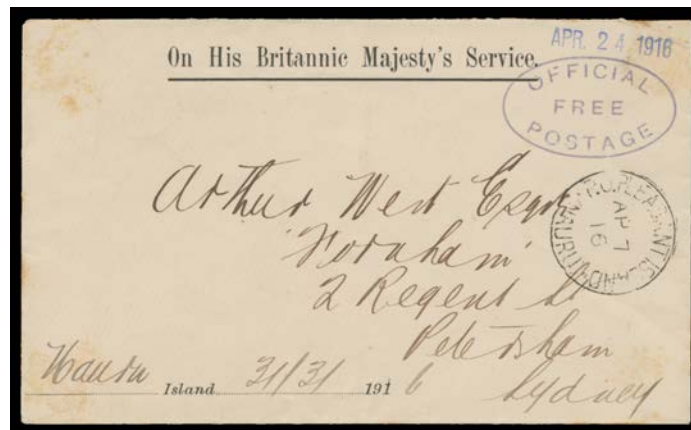
