

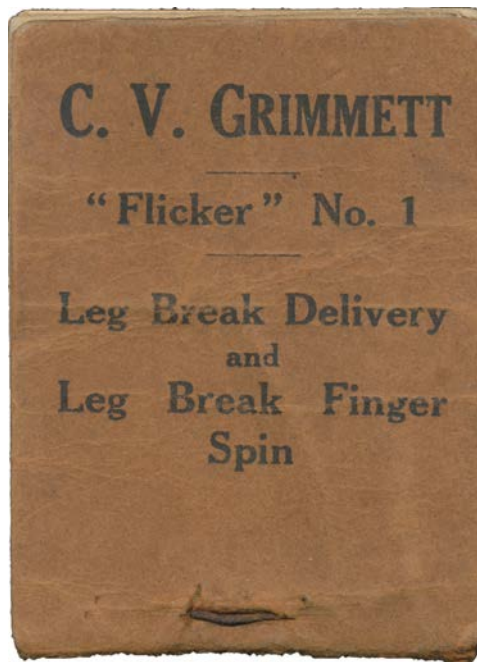

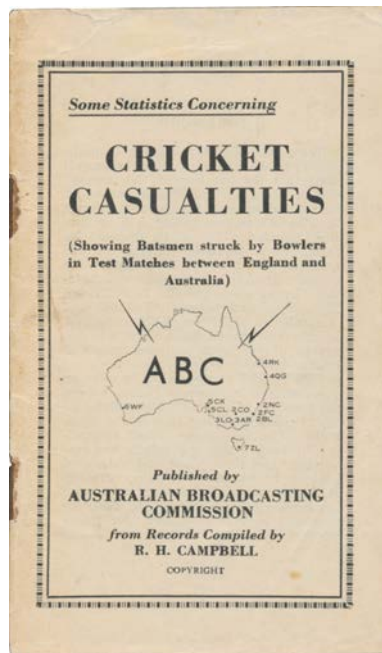

[This was *Bradman's* fourth & last Test tour to England. As captain, he was driven to not lose a single match and ruthlessly managed to achieve the feat, winning 25 matches - sometimes against great odds - and drawing 9. Such a feat has never been equalled let alone surpassed]

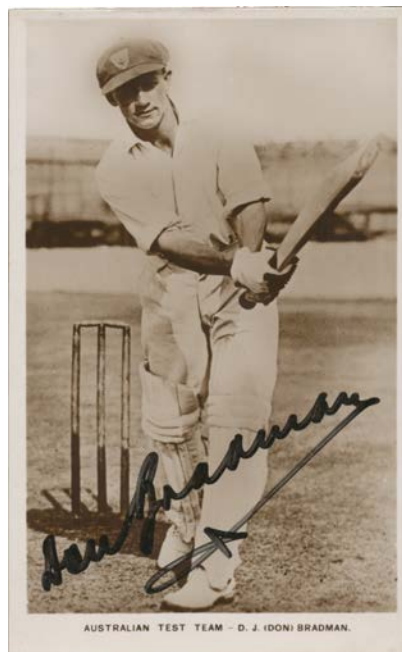

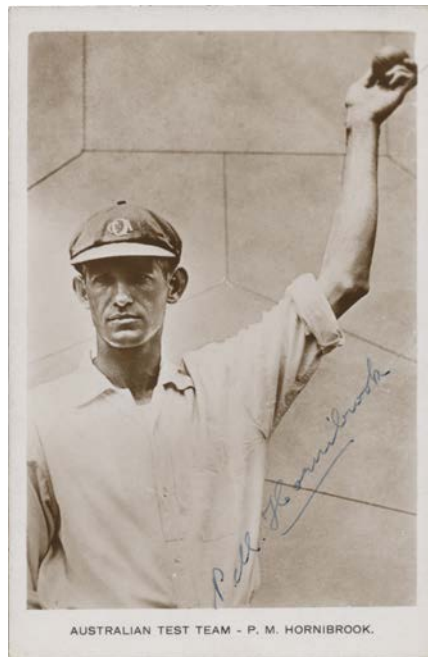
