

BPA Certificate (1978). Dick Burgess states the first 'Passed by Censor' h/s is known from 13.9.1914 and states " covers are known censored in manuscript".	1,500
1285	С	A-	1916 postcard to Sweden requesting information about "Albert Kesselhut who is a POW in Russialast heard of a year ago when he was in the hospital", 'SAMOA' KEVII ½d pair tied by 'APIA/16OC16' cds, Censor No 2 cachet in violet on face, a couple of minor marks. [From August 1915 to February 1918 the Swedish Red Cross oversaw the exchange of 60,000+ wounded POWs between Russia and the Central Powers]	200
