A remarkable item, being the only issue of its type. [This is not an uprated item. Because there was no KGV1 3d die, <i>John Ash</i> resorted to this 'doubleton' expedient. 6000 were supplied in 1938-39. Only a handful of complete wrappers are recorded. It is believed that the package contained pharmaceutical samples. <i>Mark Diserio's</i> example sold at the <i>Prestige</i> auction of 8.11.2013 for \$2760]	1,000
