967	CL	A	SOUTH ARABIA: 1965 <i>Globe Trading Agencies</i> cover endorsed "Per Second Class Airmail - Registered Sample of No Commercial Value", to Austria with 75f Arms solo franking, 'CRATER/B/15SP/65/ADEN' d/s and blue/white R label, flap unsealed for inspection, green Customs Declaration form on face stating "1 plastic bag" and 'Zollfrei' [Duty Free] cachet applied on arrival, Vienna b/s of 21.9.65.	200
968	CL	A	TRUCIAL STATES: 1963 <i>Trucial States Traders</i> airmail cover to Austria with Palm Trees 40np tied by Dubai cds. [Valid throughout the Trucial States, however usage was only in Dubai. The palm trees represented the seven Shaikhdoms but were of unequal size, which offended the smaller States. This led to Dubai withdrawing them and issuing their own stamps from June 1963]	200
