The material in this section relates more to the family's residences in England and their travels than to Cocos Islands. The impression is of a family that had done well 'in the Colonies' and was well-established in Edwardian London.

Picture Postcards 1902 (June) from Hong Kong to *Florence Clunies-Ross* in Germany redirected to "Spa, Belgien"; 1902 (Oct) from *May Clunies-Ross* in India to Florence, now in England, creased; 1904 (Mar) Singapore to England, brief message initialled "JSCR" by *John Sidney Clunies-Ross*, small repaired tear; 1907-08 two local London covers to *George Clunies-Ross*; and 1908 (June) from *George* aboard German ship "Prinz Ludwig" at Genoa, to his daughter-in-law *Frances Clunies-Ross* in England; also 1908 cover from London to *George* aboard the "Prinz Ludwig" at Genoa; and a 1909 PPC of the ship; condition variable.
