1275 S **Annotated collection of the various types used at Perth** including on multiples to 1/- pair & a few coloured strikes, many better stamps including Penny Black x2, Litho 4d & *Hillman* 6d x2, 1860 Imperf 2d vermilion x2 & 6d sage-green, Clean-Cut Perf 6d purple-brown x3, Intermediate Perf 6d purple-brown, Rough Perf 1d x3, a few Postal Fiscals etc, also '80-80' duplex on 1/- pair with Imperial Punches & several part-strikes, condition variable but a very handy lot. **(113 items)**

1276 S A A1- **Numbered Grids:** '10' (*Juhl* type I; broken '0') of Canning (2) in red-brown on 1d black SG 1 (full margins, Cat £300). PO 1.8.1852; renamed Cannington 1898.

1278 S B A1 - "14" of Albany in manuscript on 1d black SG 1 (3½ margins; just touching at top), emergency measure during repairs to numbered grid cancel.

1280 C A A1 **15 Bars:** '5' on 6d with 'GUILDFORD/MR21/1876/=WESTERN AUSTRALIA=' cds (type 1b) alongside both very fine on cover to England, 'YORK' transit & 'NEW-MALDON/MY15/76' arrival b/s, couple of very minor blemishes. PO 22.7.1859. *Census* #24.

The enclosed letter mentions both "... the prospect of telegraphic communications between this Colony and England ..." & "... a rare sight in Guildford a few month ago - a party of explorers who had come through the bush from South Australia arrived with 17 camels ...". [The expedition was lead by *Ernest Giles* (1835-1897) whose members almost perished in the Great Victoria Desert, having gone 17 days without water]

- 1281** C A- A1 - '5' of Guildford tying 3d to 1875 cover to Melbourne (b/s), very fine 'GUILDFORD/MR23/1875/ =WESTERN-AUSTRALIA=' cds alongside, minor blemishes. Carried per "China" from Albany 31/3/1875. *Census* #21. *Ex Cecil Walkley*: acquired at the *Prestige* auction of 27.11.2010 for \$414. [On 3.9.1870 the inter-Colonial rate was halved, requiring the issue of a new 3d value]

- 1282** C B A1+ - '6' superb strike - LRD - on 2d chrome-yellow & 'ALBANY/NO16/1870/=WESTERN-AUSTRALIA=' cds on cover to "Prinsep Park/Dardanup" with light 'BUNBURY' arrival cds on the face. Not in the *Census*. [NB: *PMI* states Dardanup PO was open continuously from 1867. However, no datestamps are recorded between 1870 & 1898]

Henry Charles Prinsep arrived 25.5.1866 from Singapore. He was a draftsman with the *Lands Department*; later *Under-Secretary for Mines & Protector of Aborigines*. He was also *JG Bussell's* son-in-law, and illustrated accounts of expeditions lead by *Forrest & Giles*.

- 1283** C B B1 - '8' fair strike tying 6d lilac alongside 'FREMANTLE/OC7/1878/ =WESTERN-AUSTRALIA=' cds on cover to England, 'BATH/NO25/78' arrival b/s, a few blemishes & tape residue on back flap. PO 4.12.1829. Apparently listed in the *Census* as "04-10-78".

- 1284** C A- A1- - '10' four strikes on ½d & 2d with 'BRIDGETOWN/OC18/95/W.A.' cds alongside, on cover to Germany "via Italie", 'HAMBURG/24.11.95' arrival b/s, minor aging marks. Renamed from Geejilup PO -.2.1872. *Pope & Reynolds Census* #4 of 10; the only one to a destination outside the British Empire.

1290 S A A1 - '27' of Bannister fine strike on 2d bistre. PO 1.12.1869; closed 15.2.1902.

1291 C B B1 - '29' six fair to fine strikes on 2d yellow x2 & 3d brown strip of 4 on double-rate cover to USA endorsed "Via San Francisco" with fair strike of the unframed-oval 'KOJONUP"/"12-7-76"/WESTERN AUSTRALIA' b/s, Albany & San Francisco transit cds on face where rated "10" in blue crayon for double inwards steamship fee payable, minor edge faults & a little soiled. PO 18.10.1864. *Census* #2 of three recorded items only. [The via San Francisco rate - very scarce from Western Australia - was 8d x2. *Census* #1 8d US rate ex Cecil Walkley sold at Prestige on 27.11.2010 for \$2760; *Census* #3 2d local rate sold in our sale of 19.5.2018 for \$6590(!)]

- 1294** C A- B1 - 'D' on 2d pair alongside 'DONGARA/ B /JU26/[]/W.A.' cds (#3b; no year slugs) on cover to *Clerk of Local Court, 'FREMANTLE/JU27/99/W.A.'* arrival b/s, a few very minor blemishes. Renamed from Dongarra PO 1887. **Not recorded** in the *Census*, which lists only one 18.9.1897 item with the Type 1 cds and none with the Type 3.

- 1295** C B A1- - 'E' two strikes on 1/2d & 2d alongside 'BROOMEHILL/SP19/91/W.A.' unframed cds on cover to England, Albany transit & London arrival b/s of OC24/91 in red, small edge fault at top not affecting markings. Replaced Eticup PO 1889. Not listed in the *Census*, but from the same correspondence as #1 of the 3 listed there.

- 1296** C B- A1- - 'F' five good to fine strikes on Postal Fiscals 1d pair SG F11 and Swans 1d & 4d on cover to New Zealand with 'FREMANTLE/AP28/94/=W.A.=' cds and curved '[crown]/REGISTERED' h/s alongside, Wellington & Dunedin b/s, some edge faults & staining at U/L. PO 4.12.1829. Not listed in the *Census*.

- 1297** C B - 'GT' three good to fine strikes on Perf 14 2d chrome-yellow strip of 3 & very fine unframed 'GERALDTON/ DE24/88/=WA=' cds (Christmas Eve) on cover to GB, Perth duplex transit & London arrival b/s of FE4/89, repairs at U/L corner & on the flap. *Ex Cecil Walkley*: sold at the *Prestige* auction of 15.11.2010 for \$437. [Not in the *Census*]
