2053	PS	A-	<b>1945</b> inter-Camp usage of Japanese Occupation 5s Postal Card from an internee at <i>Camp Tjimahi</i> in West Java to another at "Kamp Halmahera" near Semarang, Central Java with pre-occupation 'BANDOENG/-2.10.45' cds, contemporary annotations & minor blemishes. [Dutch POWs and Internees continued to be held in camps after the Japanese surrender on 15.08.1945 and were not liberated until four months later and on the condition that they leave Indonesia; under the terms of their surrender, Japanese troops were to re-establish authority and in October 1945 they drove Indonesian Independence forces out of Bandoeng and handed the city over to the British]	250

JA Jettinghoff, Techn Batln Balikpapan, c/- GPO 1386R Brisbane" (return address on flap) with Pictorials 5c & Wilhelmina 10c tied by boxed 'NEDERLANDSCH INDIES/PTT/16-FEB-1946/BALIKPAPAN' d/s, 'Passed by/RNF Censor/[signature]/No.[ ]' cachet in violet on face, light horizontal fold. [After Indonesia declared independence on 17.08.1945, the Dutch landed Forces stationed in Australia at major cities including Balikpapan on Borneo in an attempt to re-take their former colony]
