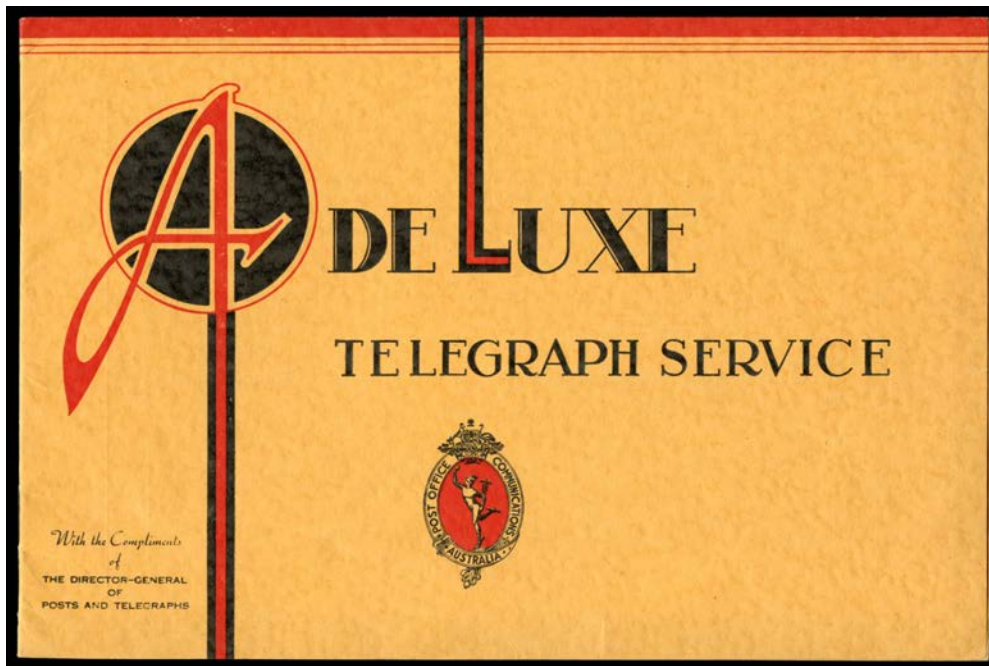

1872	C	A-	AUSTRIA: 1935 to Sydney with Costumes 10g & 1s plus Cathedral 2s all tied by Vienna '27.XII.35' cds, 'TELEGRAPHENAMT WIEN 1' b/s of same date for pneumatic transmission to airport, carried by <i>Imperial Airways</i> flight IE405 during which the <i>City of Khartoum</i> ran out of fuel two kilometers from Alexandria harbour, plunging into the sea & killing the nine passengers and three crew members, with the GPO Sydney explanatory leaflet which accompanied recovered articles, envelope in surprisingly fine condition under the circumstances. <i>Sanford</i> #351231; covers from this disaster other than from Great Britain are rare.
