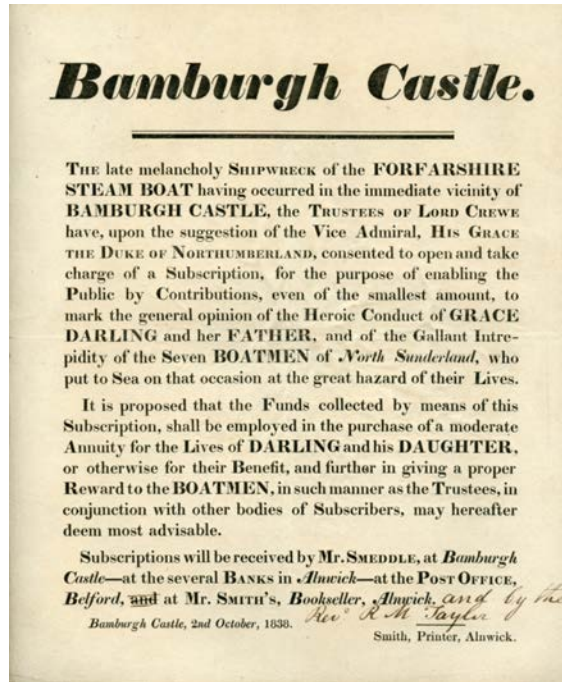

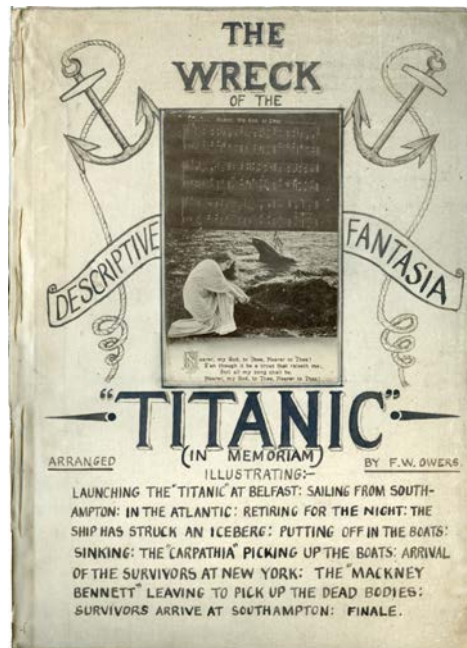

**GREAT BRITAIN - SHIPWRECKS:** Collection of Grace Darling material including rare 1838 'Bamburgh Castle' broadsheet raising funds for an Annuity for the Heroic Grace Darling and her Father; books (3) including 'Grace Darling - The Heroine of the Farne Isles' [Southampton, 1875]; postcard; and Rowtree chocolates tin. [Grace Darling (1815-1842) was an English lighthouse keeper's daughter, famed for participating in the rescue of survivors from the shipwrecked *Forfarshire* in 1838: the paddlesteamer ran aground on the Farne Islands off the coast of Northumberland; nine members of her crew were saved] (6)

**GREAT BRITAIN - SUFFRAGETTE MOVEMENT:** 'VOTES FOR WOMEN' original WSPU sash in movement's colour scheme (designed by Emmeline Pethick-Lawrence in 1908) of purple for loyalty and dignity, white for purity and green for hope. The Women's Social and Political Union was a women-only political movement and leading militant organisation campaigning for women's suffrage in the United Kingdom from 1903 to 1917. Known from 1906 as the suffragettes, its membership and policies were tightly controlled by Emmeline Pankhurst. A very rare survivor from this important political movement.

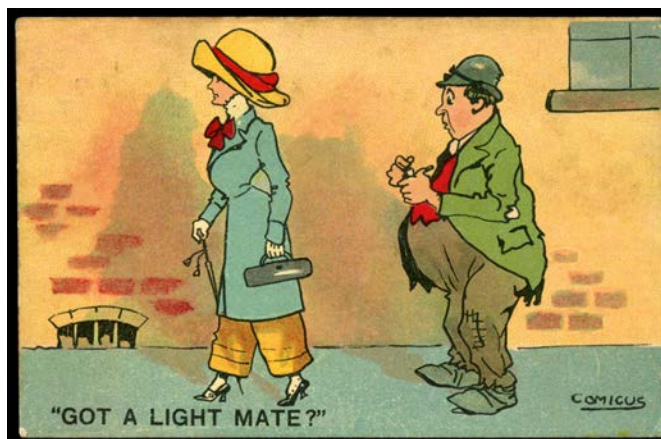

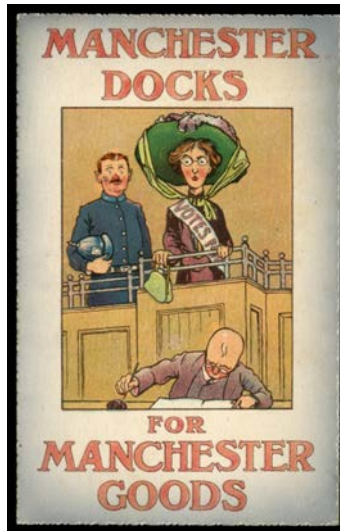
