Carried ex Sydney per 'Rakaia' 1.4.1867, arrived Panama 4.5.1867; ex Colon per 'Tamar' 6.5.1867; ex St Thomas per 'Douro' 14.5.1867, arrived Southampton 26.5.1867. The via Panama service operated 1866-69 only.

The enclosed letter headed "Sydney Infirmary/March 27 1867" & signed "John M Creed" states "...appointed surgeon to the South Australian Northern Territory Exploration Expedition...We are going to find a site for a new settlement on the North Coast of Australia...I am going amongst a lot of people who have never seen a white man yet and who are reputed to be cannibals..." [Dr John Mildred Creed, as part of Captain Francis Cadell's party, explored the west coast of the Gulf of Carpentaria & as far west as Port Darwin. Elected to the NSW Legislative Council in 1885, he was an ardent social reformer and opponent of the White Australia Policy]
