[This is the example illustrated by <i>Campbell</i> at page 176, where Types 1 & 2 are transposed. At page 175, he states that the LRD is 2.2.1867, clearly an error for this item which is a month later]	450

[Thargomindah is 980km due W of Brisbane &, obviously, is "back o Bourke"! In 1898 it became one of the first towns in Australia to be powered by hydro-electricity]
